Since 1997, the Board of Directors of **Leadership Huron County** has been committed to improving our quality of life by developing future leaders who can meet the challenges ahead. Confidential Application

Leadership Huron County participants will be selected on the basis of completed applications that are received by **January 31, 2026** (NOTE: Applications received after this date will be considered only if space remains in the class.)

Leadership Huron County is open to anyone who lives and/or works in Huron County. First priority for admission will be given to Huron County residents. Applicants who live and work outside the county will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis after all Huron County applications are reviewed.

Preference will be given to candidates who, in addition to their leadership potential, would contribute to the overall strength and diversity of the class, and who can commit to the time required to complete the program.

Requirements for Successful Participation:

1. **Attendance:** In 2026, The *Leadership Huron County* program will begin on March 12th, and will conclude on December 10th. Classes meet **8:30am – 4:30pm**. A full calendar of classes is attached here and will be provided to members at the first class meeting on March 12th, 2026. Normally, classes will meet on the 2nd Thursday of each month; however, the calendar is subject to change depending on availability of some facilities. Members will be notified well in advance should any changes be necessary. **Participants should note the class dates and arrange their personal and work schedules well in advance in order to be able to attend all meetings.**

Attendance at the first class of the year is mandatory. Candidates who are unable to attend the March 12th meeting are asked to consider waiting until the next class year to apply for the program.

Attendance at each class session is critical to the participant's success. In extenuating circumstances, **if an absence is necessary, the program consultant must be notified in advance.**

2. **Tuition:** Tuition for the *Leadership Huron County* program is \$850. The candidate and/or sponsor will be billed for the tuition upon the candidate's acceptance into the program. **2026 Tuition payments are due by Thursday, March 12th, 2026.** Some scholarship assistance is available to individuals who may not be able to participate without a sponsor.

Applicants who desire scholarship assistance should notify the program consultant when they submit their applications for the program. The LHC Executive Board will conduct scholarship interviews on Monday, February, 16th at 8:00am at Sheri's Coffee House in Norwalk, and again on Thursday, February 19th at 8:00am at the Methodist Church on West Main St. in Norwalk.

3. **Involvement:** Participation in the *Leadership Huron County* program requires a commitment of time from each individual, not only out of respect for his or her employer sponsor, but out of respect for the individual's team members and for the speakers who freely give of their time to meet with the classes. An individual's success in the program depends in large part upon the degree to which he or she commits to active engagement in every aspect of the program.
4. **Leadership Strengths Assessment:** Individuals admitted to the program will be asked to complete the Clifton Strengths Assessment online prior to the first meeting on **March 12th**. The assessment will be delivered to participants' email addresses well in advance of the first meeting.

1) Comment on your overall experience in the Leadership Huron County program.

- I loved the last few classes that my classmates planned. The leadership development portion was beneficial, but going to all of the different places in the county and learning of all the small businesses made this experience unique.
- Identifying my strengths as a leader & being comfortable with change & new adventures (no matter how many!).
- Being able to build relationships with other professionals in Huron County, networking. Also becoming more aware of all that Huron County has to offer – my eyes have been opened.
- The two aspects of the program that were by far the most beneficial to me were the connections formed with classmates and the knowledge I gained of opportunities throughout Huron County.
